## **Functional Area Description**

Upon completion of the Policy and Resourcing (PR) Functional Area Certification, the PR professional will have a broader and deeper understanding of national, combatant command and specific security cooperation policies, strategies, plans, and resourcing activities that advance national security objectives in support of U.S. foreign policy. Specifically, workforce members will identify their roles and responsibilities within the security cooperation workforce as a policy writer, strategist, planner or resource manager.

### How will this prepare you better for your work?

These courses focus not only on processes but use real world examples and case studies to reinforce learning. The PR expert will have a broader and deeper understanding of how security cooperation activities nest within the wider spectrum of strategies and plans. The PR expert will understand adversary security cooperation activities, and be prepared to lead security cooperation policy, strategy, plans and/or resource development. Finally, the PR expert will have increased understanding of allied and partner nation budgetary cycles.
