### Functional Area Description

This functional area is focused on SC activities planned and conducted by designated members of the National Guard's State Partnership Program. The State Partnership Program (SPP) functional area enables the SCW to understand, implement, integrate, and sustain the State Partnership Program (USC Title 10, §341) as part of U.S. Security Cooperation in alignment with and support of U.S. foreign policy and security interests.

### How will this better prepare you for your work?

The learner will have a foundational understanding of the SPP as one T10 programs within the Security Cooperation enterprise; understand how SPP partnerships are created and are aligned with U.S. strategic guidance in support of U.S. foreign policy goals and objectives; and recognize the importance of building long-term relationships with partner nations to achieve common goals. They will also gain a general understanding of the National Guard as the manager and administrator of the SPP.
